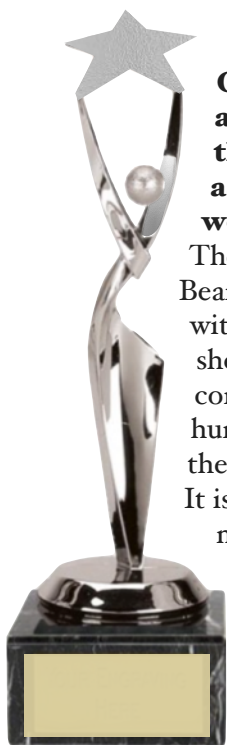
THE ANTI-RACISM PARENT SURVEY

IT'S GREENWICH TIME



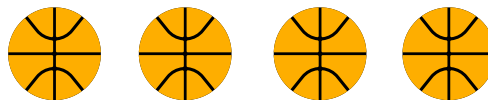
Congratulations to the children in Greenwich Class as they completed their first class assembly this week.

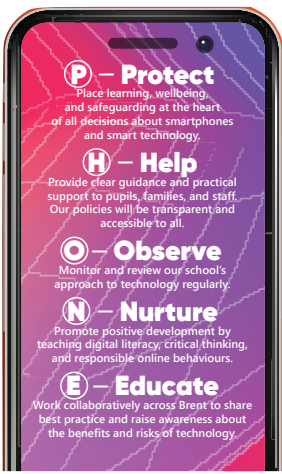

Safeguarding is at the heart of everything we do at Anson, ensuring that every child feels safe, supported, valued and able to thrive both in school and beyond.

CONNECTION, COMMUNICATION, COMMUNITY



At Anson, we proudly support the Brent Phone Pledge and our commitment to creating a phone-free environment for children. It was one of the areas of focus for Headteachers at our annual conference this week.

As you may be aware research highlights the significant impact that meaningful communication between parents and children has on language development, wellbeing and future learning success. Indeed, those few minutes before and after school provide valuable opportunities for conversation that can so easily be lost if a screen is involved.

Of course, there are also important safeguarding reasons for keeping phones away in the playground and you will notice that all children hand their phones in before the school day begins. This should also be true for adults on the playground. Mobile phones can create risks through unauthorised photography or filming of children, accidental sharing of images online, distraction from supervising children, reduced awareness of potential safety concerns and

challenges in identifying who is collecting a child. For this reason, we have reminded everyone at Anson that no member of staff should release a child to a parent or carer who is actively using a phone. In line with the pledge, Brent schools are phone-free zones and we ask all families to support this approach.

Most importantly, the moment of dropping off or collecting your child is often one of the most rewarding parts of their day. These conversations help to:

1. Strengthen family relationships.
2. Develop language and vocabulary in any language spoken at home.
3. Support children's emotional wellbeing.
4. Encourage listening skills.
5. Create lifelong memories..

These daily moments matter. By putting phones away we create space for connection, communication and community.
